You could put them into sentences or even make a word search. • Write about something that you did in the half term holidays. Can you write about the event in the style of a newspaper report? <p>Numeracy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revise the properties of quadrilaterals -square, rectangle, rhombus, parallelogram and trapezium • Practise telling the time in analogue and digital. Practise finding the difference between times. • Draw some different quadrilaterals- can you use a protractor to measure and label the angles inside the shapes you have drawn? • Play on Times Tables Rock Stars every day. • Take a greater depth challenge from class to solve at home. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Carry out some research into South America and create a poster or fact file about what you have learnt. - Research South American food - plan and make a South American style feast for your family! -Write a narrative poem like the one featured in Matt Goodfellow's The Final Year. You could base your poem on your thoughts and feelings about moving into your final year at primary school. -Visit your local library and see if you can find another book by David Almond or Matt Goodfellow. Can you write a book review about it after you have read it? -Create your own graphic novel or comic strip. You could take inspiration from illustrator Dave McKean.
