- Spend some time baking for your friends and family. - Learn a new skill. <i>For example, sewing, painting or a new sport.</i> - Create a piece of autumn art work; You could use natural resources you have collected. -Have a go at making a healthy sandwich or new recipe. Create a step by step recipe that others can follow. - Play a musical instrument and showcase to your family. - Complete a family workout – this could be a dance, walk or a circuit! - Create some artwork using the Tate website, such as continuous line drawings or designing buildings https://www.tate.org.uk/kids/make - Create a poster or presentation about an out of school club you attend. - Practise your typing skills using 2Type on Purple Mash (in computing tools section). - Create a photo story all about your summer holidays.	Literacy: - Write a review of your favourite book of all time. - Try reading a book by a new author! Either borrow a book from school or visit your local library. - Write about something that you did in the summer holidays – in the style of a newspaper report. - Practise and learn the spellings listed below. You could make the spellings using letters cut out from magazines and newspapers. Numeracy: - Log on and practise on Times Table Rock Stars. - Test yourself on Level 5 questions on Top Marks. Repeat the questions and see if you can improve your time! https://www.topmarks.co.uk/mathsgames/daily10 - Practise column addition & subtraction – can you challenge yourself to use decimals? - Play the place value game with a friend; each draw a place value grid (like below) – take it in turns to roll the dice & decide where to place the number in your grid. The winner is the person who makes the largest number. What did they do? What did they look like? Create your own poster or model. - Present and record your own news report as if you are reporting live from Eyam at the time of the plague. - Plague Survival Guide. Make a leaflet advising Eyam villagers on how to survive the plague—using 17th-century remedies and beliefs, but clearly labelled as “historical advice” so it’s safe. This could be illustrated with herbs, plague doctor masks, and symbols. - Compare your current self to when you were a baby, listing the key similarities and differences. - Draw a timeline to show the changes in humans from birth to old age. - Research different and unusual frame structures around the world. Present your findings in an information poster. - Draw and describe a life cycle for an animal of your choice.
