- Learn how to make a new healthy snack. Can you create a recipe and instructions to explain how to make your snack? - Complete chores around the house to help your grown-ups! For example, washing the pots, Hoovering etc. - Learn a new game that can be played outside. Teach somebody else your game! - Practise telling the time using an analogue and digital clock. Read the time using the 12 and 24 hour clock. - Spend at least one evening a week without playing on anything electronic. - Learn how to count to 30 in a different language. - Create a piece of artwork that represents your favourite place or memory from this summer.	Literacy: -Collect a 'spelling, punctuation and grammar activity mat' from the classroom. - Practise using brackets, commas and dashes from Year 5 – can you write sentences, or a short paragraph, with examples using all of these. -Learn the spellings in the box below – practise putting the words into sentences. Numeracy: -Collect a 'maths activity mat' from the classroom. -Learn your times tables up to 12 X 12 - in and out of order- and be able to give an answer in 5 seconds. Learn the division facts related to these tables. For example, $9 \times 7 = 63$ $63 \div 9 = 7$ Use TTRockstars to help. https://trockstars.com/login - Practise using column addition and column subtraction. Add and subtract numbers with up to six digits, including decimal numbers, e.g. 7346.03 - 5782.94 Make sure you are lining up the numbers correctly! Practise bus stop division and column multiplication using two- and three-digit numbers – e.g. 756 divided by 3 $842 \times 37 =$ (not forgetting the magic 0!)	- Design a recipe based on WW2 rations. - Draw a map of the world showing all the countries involved in WW2. - Find out about how Sheffield was affected during WW2. You could research the Sheffield Blitz and create a poster or powerpoint about this. - Find out who Anne Frank was – create a fact file all about her. - Make your own model of a WW2 air raid shelter, gas mask or aircraft. - Find out about code breaking during WW2. You could even have a go at creating your own code for someone to break! - Research WW2 propaganda posters and then design your own.
