<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bake some mince pies or a different sweet treat (please tweet/email us a photo rather than bringing them into school) - Complete a charitable project-. You could volunteer in a soup kitchen, donate some of your old toys and clothes to people in need or create a gift box to send to someone who has very little. https://www.samaritans-purse.org.uk/what-we-do/operation-christmas-child/ - Learn a new skill. <i>For example, sewing, painting or a new sport.</i> - Complete a week of 'Help at home' - find ways to be helpful. You could tidy up, lay the table or clean the car. Keep a diary of what you do. - Learn a song and perform it to your family. - Create a photo story all about the traditions of a family celebration. It could be Christmas, Eid or Diwali or something else you celebrate. - Practise your typing skills using word. 	<p>Literacy:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Try reading a book by a new author! Either borrow a book from school or visit your local library. - Write a book review of a book that you have enjoyed recently. - Try reading some poetry. Bring your favourite poem into school to share with the class. You could even recommend your favourite poet. - Practise and learn the spellings listed below. You could make the spellings using letters cut out from magazines and newspapers. <p>Maths:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Practise your times tables daily. -Take a multiplication board game from the classroom (choose a times table you find tricky) and play it regularly. - Play on Times Tables Rock Stars every day - Collect some data at home and present it in a line graph. For example - you could measure your pulse rate before and at different points during exercise and record this on a line graph. - Take a greater depth challenge from class to solve at home. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Create a fact file for a country from North or South America. Draw a map of the country and label where major physical features (mountains, lakes, rivers) and human features (cities, towns, important buildings) are in the country. <p>Draw a detailed diagram of a biome or make a model of a biome. For example - you could focus on a rainforest, drawing and labelling the types of plants and animal found at different heights.</p> <p>Carry out some research about William Morris. Record five interesting facts about him. Create some art work inspired by his repeating designs art work. Be creative!</p> <p>Carry out some research about Jess Ennis-Hill. Create a fact file about her.</p> <p>Create a collage to represent a landscape of human or physical features.
